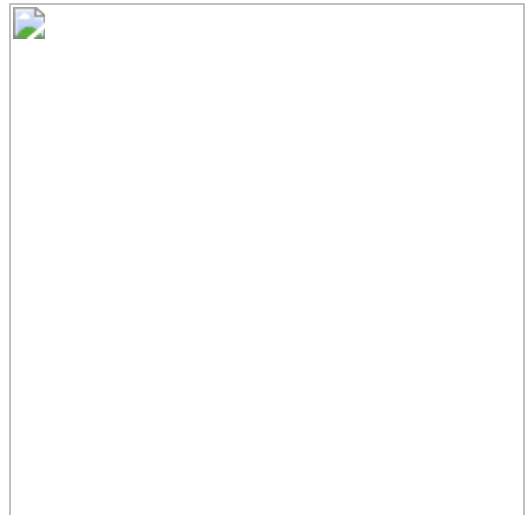

As one of our most skilled ornithologists exclaimed: “Wow! These (photos) are great! I did not know that AMDIs would occasionally be piscivores!”

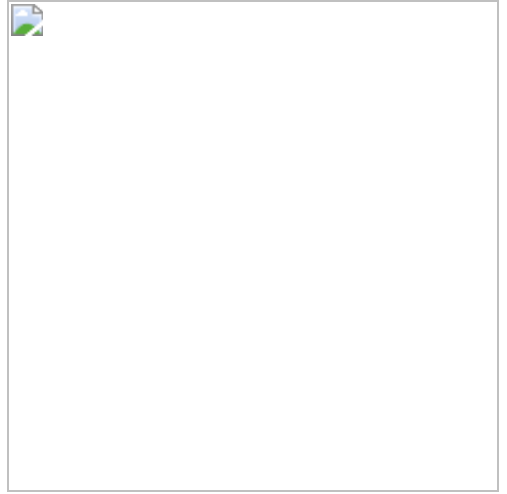
