Each lesson is connected to and builds upon previous lessons, but because they also stand alone, parents are welcome to pick only the topics that most interesting to their students. The classes include a webinar-style nature lesson, a short activity, nature journaling, outdoor exploration and group sharing. We have students participating from Evergreen, Conifer, Littleton, Illinois AND Washington D.C.! It has been especially fun for the young people to compare springtime discoveries with others who log-on from different elevations and even different parts of the country!
