In less than a year, I was promoted to Exhibits & Public Events Coordinator, and two years later received another promotion to Public Events Director. As the Public Events Director, I cultivated unprecedented growth in the Public Programs department. Within the first two years in my role,

I increased our annual program attendance by 67%, our program offerings by 20%, and our partnership engagement by 80%.

When I am not working, you will still find me outdoors. I love camping, hiking, backpacking, and the overall exploration of nature. I have been downhill skiing since I was two years old and joined the National Ski Patrol in 2008 as a certified Outdoor Emergency Care Technician.
